Recyclable (place into blue bins)


- Plastic #1
- Plastic #2
- metal cans (aluminum/tin/steel)
- paper (newspaper, notebook, mail, etc)
- paperboard
- cardboard

Not recyclable (put into trash cans)

- Other plastics
 - *–* #3, #4, #5, #6, #7
 - Un-labled plastics
 - Plastic film (ie, bags, bubble wrap, food wrapping)
- Food & drink
- Pizza boxes
- Furniture, wood, electronics, scrap metal, light bulbs, chemicals, batteries, pressurized cans



What can I do to be more sustainable?

SIMPLE TIPS FOR LIVING GREEN



You can ... Save Paper

- Use a flash drive to store your class-related materials
- Encourage your faculty to post documents on a faculty web page & download them to a portable electronic device.
- Print only when necessary.
- Print double sided, use narrow margins, single space, smaller or <u>Sprang Ecofont</u>.



You can ... Save Energy!

- Turn out lights when you leave a room and adjust the temperature accordingly and conservatively.
- Unplug appliances, don't just turn them off. If a little red light is on, they are using electricity. Plug all electronics into a power strip; turn it off when not in use.
- Your dorm/apartment is not supposed to be the same temperature all year round. Wear warm clothes in the winter, cool clothes in the summer, and adjust the temperature accordingly.



You can ... Save Water!

- Turn off the water when brushing your teeth or washing dishes in the sink.
- Take shorter showers.
- Report running faucets and toilets and leaky plumbing fixtures to Maintenance Direct (online).



You can ... Save, Save, Save!!!

- Use a refillable water bottle & coffee cup.
- Walk instead of taking the shuttle or your car. It saves gas and it makes you healthier.
- Ride your bike! It's fun.
- Drive less combine trips and do your shopping all at once. It saves time, gas, & money.
- Get a cloth grocery bag or a mesh laundry bag and leave it in your car.
