Budget: Strawder reported approx. \$78,000 remaining in current budget. No increases have been asked for in the student fee meetings. Discussion on using Foundation funds (~\$7500 balance) for Symposium dinner for small group.

ENSC Club: J. Steele reported the plant sale is ongoing and multiple local cleanups (e.g., river cleanup with Keep Milledgeville Baldwin Beautiful). The recent camping trip to Raven Cliffs was a success including sorting and recycling items from campground trash bins. Alum, Justina Eberhart will be a guest speaker on Oct 19th.

Gardening Club: **Vandevoort** reported a successful ribbon cutting on Oct 5th. Great promotional time with Dr. Dorman. Workdays have been scheduled and the Council is advised to check the facebook page for dates/times.

Sustainability Certificate: **Oetter** reported the proposal will be reviewed in the COAS Curriculum committee 10/14. Positive feedback thus far.

Internships: Strawder reported the need for more interns in the Sustainability office. She would like the Council to consider for next meeting (Nov 11) establishing paid internships for recycling and garden projects.

Sustainability & Food Day: Strawder asked for help spreading the word on activities and speakers for this event (Oct 19th and 20th).

America Recycles Day: Groebner noted that tabling is set and volunteers are needed. Strawder said that e-waste collection is in process and may be available. Oetter asked if more recycling bins are needed overall and that a clear, well-communicated plan for trash and recycling needs to be established. Groebner noted that the big need is for dedicated cardboard containers that are big. Brodzik has met with Greek representatives and sorted out the availability of recycling bins for special events. Strawder also noted that a new glass recycling vendor is being vetted.
