### Agenda Item: Focus on Active Initiatives

Presenter: Emma

Discussion: Emma and Andrew met with SGA president about concerns with involvement and campus response to sustainability initiatives. Students start sustainability projects and then graduate. Once they leave, there may be no one left in charge of various projects. Once a project is successfully launched, there is a need for someone to take it over and keep it running.

Strawder - A lot of initiatives on table, office of sustainability has responsibility, but current staffing is stretched thin

Shea – student clubs should be doing its own recruiting (ex. Garden club)

Emma -- But compost or recycling - how are these initiatives being run? Will need staffing and funding.

Emma -- Bike share program is a student initiative, but will need campus support once initiatives are established

Emma -- Why are we using student fee to handle the university's waste management?

Shea – student fee paid for recycling bins, but did not pay for the labor to handle the extra work.

Sustainability initiatives often require extra work for other departments.

ACTION: Year end report should include outline need for and request staff position to act as recycling coordinator, composter, etc.
