Super Blue Blood Moon 2018

On the morning of January 31st, 2018, a combination of three lunar events occurred -- a supermoon, a blue moon, and a total lunar eclipse. This hasn't been seen anywhere on Earth since December 1982. For the Eastern time zone, the lunar eclipse will only be partial. The next lunar eclipse will be on Jan. 21, 2019. This one will be visible throughout all of the U.S. and will be a supermoon, but it won't be a blue moon. Check out some photos of the Super Blue Blood Moon from around the world, here!
