America Recycles Day

America Recycles Day was celebrated on the Georgia College Campus with two events: Weigh the Waste and a Foundation Hall Waste Audit.

Weigh the Waste

On Tuesday, November 13th, interns and staff from the Office of Sustainability (OOS) joined together during the afternoon lunch period (11:30 a.m. to 2:00 p.m.) to collect food waste from students, faculty, and staff. 140 pounds of food waste was recovered in this two and a half hour time frame – an increase of almost 45 pounds from last year's Weigh the Waste. For the event, the OOS collected the food waste from plates as they were brought to the dish room in the Max and weighed the waste on site.

Why is food waste a problem? At the national level, Americans waste 40% of the food we produce. This food waste costs the US \$218 billion a year. Not only is there an economic loss, there are also harmful environmental effects. Rotting food creates methane, a greenhouse gas 25 times more potent than the greenhouse gas we hear about most often, carbon dioxide.

To decrease your amount of food waste, only get as much food as you're going to eat. Start with one plate and finish it before going for more. If you would like more information on Weigh the Waste or how you can get involved in future sustainability events, please contact the OOS.

Waste Audit

As part of America Recycles Day, the Office of Sustainability staff and interns worked alongside members of the Georgia College staff from Operations & Maintenance and Grounds & Landscaping conducted a waste audit at Foundation Hall. The recycling bins and trash cans by Foundation were sorted into four piles – materials found in the recycling bins that were correctly recycled, materials found in the recycling bins that should have been put in the trash, materials in the trash cans that should have been recycled, and materials that were correctly put in the trash.

Findings showed, for those who are recycling, they are doing very well at keeping the contamination down. However, also found was a lot of recycling that was being thrown out as trash, mostly plastic bottles, cans, and cardboard. As a reminder, in Milledgeville, you can recycle plastics 1 and 2 (the number can be found on the bottle or plastic item, normally at the bottom), paper, aluminum, and non-greasy cardboard (i.e. not pizza boxes). Please make sure all foods and liquids are cleaned off/emptied out of the recyclable materials. Below are the pictures taken from the audit:


